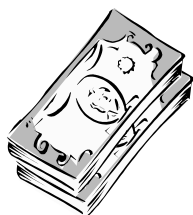

Pflugerville Votes!

November 8, 2005 Texans will vote on the nine proposed state constitutional amendments listed below. Don't forget to vote and let your voice be heard. Early voting Monday, Oct. 24th - Friday Nov. 4th. Below all begin The Constitutional Amendment...

1. Creating the Texas rail relocation and improvement fund and authorizing grants of money and issuance of obligations for financing the relocation, rehabilitation, and expansion of rail facilities.
2. Providing that marriage in this state consists only of the union of one man and one woman and prohibiting this state or a political subdivision of this state from creating or recognizing any legal status identical or similar to marriage.
3. Clarifying that certain economic development programs do not constitute a debt.
4. Authorizing the denial of bail to a criminal defendant who violates a condition of the defendant's release pending trial.
5. Allowing the legislature to define rates of interest for commercial loans.
6. To include one additional public member and a constitutional county court judge in the membership of the State Commission on Judicial Conduct.
7. Authorizing line-of-credit advances under a reverse mortgage.
8. Providing for the clearing of land titles by relinquishing and releasing any state claim to sovereign ownership or title to interest in certain land in Upshur County and in Smith County.
9. Authorizing the legislature to provide for a six-year term for a board member of a regional mobility authority.
